## What is Policy Engagement?

- Focus on changing policies of systems or institutions through government programs, budgets, regulations, laws, or judicial decisions
- Can be at institutional, local, state, or national level
- Does not have to be partisan
- Advocacy: any activity that supports or opposes a cause or issue
- Lobbying: communications intended to influence specific legislation





## **Common Entry Points to Advocacy**

- 1. Critical learning moment
- 2. Passion for a cause
- 3. Crisis moment within an issue/community
- 4. Desire to deepen/broaden impact
- 5. Desire to deploy assets beyond money





## Five Practical Ways to Influence Policy

- 1. Focus on a (specific) issue
- 2. Fund research to move the issue forward
- 3. Recruit (or be) unexpected messengers
- 4. Engage government (early)
- 5. Prepare for the long game (beyond the vote)
